

Shimane University Action Guidelines in Response to COVID-19

As of June 14, 2022

As a rule, the guidelines are common to the whole university, but judgements may be made by each campus or faculty/organization in accordance with the situation.

1	Minimum restrictions	Research activities are allowed with taken to prevent the infectious spread, such as wearing face masks, denying entry to those who are sick, checking body temperature at home, sanitizing hands and fingers, and avoiding "the three Cs". Face-to-face classes are allowed when either the dean of the faculty/graduate school or the Vice President of Education judges that these classes meet the following requirements while taking necessary prevention measures. 1) Classes that do not involve vocal or physical contact between multiple students. 2) Classes with a small number of students, securing enough space between them.	Both face-to-face and online classes are offered. However, online classes are encouraged. Face-to-face classes are allowed when either the dean of the faculty/graduate school or the Vice President of Education judges that these classes meet the following requirements while taking necessary prevention measures. 1) Classes that do not involve vocal or physical contact between multiple students. 2) Classes with a small number of students, securing enough space between them.	As a rule, entry to campus is permitted only when people have one of the following reasons: 1) They have classes 2) They need to engage in research activities 3) They participate in the permitted extracurricular activities 4) They unavoidably need to use the library, cafeteria, and shops on campus.	Extracurricular activities are limited to two hours a day, three times a week. These activities shall include only SU members and be held within Shimane Prefecture. However, prior notification of the activity is required. Activities involving overnight stays are not permitted. However, participation in competitions and presentations organized by federations exclusively for university students may be permitted only when approved by the Vice President of Education.	As a rule, online meetings only.	Allow delays and post-processing of procedures for some work with the utmost care to prevent the infectious spread. Consider staggered working hours and working from home if projects can be completed at home.	Entry is restricted.
3	Severe restrictions	Only the entry of the minimum number of laboratory members are permitted in order to continue on-going experiments and research. Those who enter the laboratory should reduce the total hours of staying there. Other research staff should work from home.	Online classes only.	As a rule, online classes only. However, in case that the classes are related to national license examinations and cannot be conducted online, and experiments and practical work including graduation thesis or dissertation which are essential to graduation, small group face-to-face classes are permitted while following the infection prevention guidelines with the utmost consideration taken to prevent the infectious spread only when approved by the dean of faculty/graduate school.	As a rule, entry to campus is prohibited. However, people may enter campus if they have one of the following reasons: 1) They have prior permission to take online classes at campus, as they do not have any equipment or Internet setup at home. 2) They need to engage in education/research activity essential to their graduation that cannot be conducted online. 3) They unavoidably need to use the library, cafeteria and shops on campus 4) They are required by the university to come to campus.	Prohibited (except for online activities)	As a rule, online meetings only.	Allow delays and post-processing of procedures for some work, and reduce the number of staff coming to the university. Other staff should work from home.	Entry is restricted.
4	Maximum restrictions	Only the research staff listed below are permitted to enter their laboratories. They are required to take turns whenever possible to avoid staying there at the same time as someone else. 1) Research staff currently engaged in long-term experiments that would bring significant loss to their research if stopped. 2) Research staff who are involved in finishing or suspending on-going experiments. 3) Research staff entering laboratories to take care of living organisms, replenish liquid nitrogen, conduct maintenance to preserve research materials such as repairing freezers, or conduct server maintenance.	Online classes only.	Online classes only.	As a rule, entry to campus is prohibited. However, people may enter campus if they have one of the following reasons: 1) They have prior permission to take online classes at campus, as they do not have any equipment or Internet setup at home. 2) They are required by the university to come to campus.	Prohibited (except for online activities)	Online meetings only.	Minimum number of staff come to work for a short time and take turns to continue essential on-going business. Staff should avoid meeting each other when taking turns. Other staff work from home as a rule.	As a rule, only the gate with the gatekeeper should be opened. Those who enter should show their ID and register their entry at gate house.
5	All suspended	In order to maintain the minimum level of the university's functions, research staff may enter their laboratories for a short time only for such purposes as taking care of living organisms, replenishing liquid nitrogen, repairing freezers, or conducting server maintenance, with permission from the department or organization head. As a rule, they are required to take turns whenever possible to avoid staying there at the same time as someone else.	Online classes only. (Faculty members are prohibited from giving online classes on campus.) No on-campus facilities are available for online classes.	Online classes only. (Faculty members are prohibited from giving online classes on campus.) No on-campus facilities are available for online classes.	Prohibited.	Prohibited (except for online activities)	Online meetings only.	As a rule, staff should work from home, unless they have urgent business which needs to be handled at their work place. Entry to buildings and other facilities such as the sports field requires entry permission and registration.	Only entry for urgent business is permitted. ※1 These restrictions do not apply to medical staff and researchers concerning COVID-19.

※2 These guidelines are subject to change at any time in response to future changes in the situation.

※3 The university library, cafeteria and shops are open with the utmost consideration taken to prevent the infectious spread, including the decision to open them or not.

※4 Online classes are referred to as "real time" and "on-demand" type classes.

※5 While monitoring the infection situation in Shimane as well as in Japan, the university will consider to increase gradually the number of face-to-face classes.
